**Special Presenters for the 2014 Alumni Reunion**

**Dr. Robert Heasley, Ph.D, CMFT** has a clinical practice in individual, marriage and family therapy in Swarthmore, PA. He sees individuals and couples dealing with a range of issues including sexuality, intimacy, relationships, and healing from childhood and young adult trauma. Robert believes we heal by embracing our emotions, letting go of fear, and finding our strengths that allow us to make changes in our lives. Dr. Heasley is also Professor of Sociology at Indiana University of Pennsylvania and Adjunct Professor of Human Sexuality at Widener University. He teaches courses primarily in the areas of sexuality and gender, with a focus on the study of men and masculinities. Robert has published a range of articles related to the study of men and boys with a focus on the making and meaning of masculinity and its relationship to male sexuality and relationships in men's lives. His work has been cited in academic publications as well as the New York Times and the Reader's Digest. He has been a guest on WHYY's program Voices in the Family and on the NPR program, *On Point*.

**Dr. Rory Reid, Ph.D, LCSW** has extensive clinical and research experience working with hypersexual behavior, pathological gambling, and adult ADHD. He currently holds a position as an Assistant Professor and Research Psychologist at the UCLA Department of Psychiatry. With a background in neuropsychology, social work, and marriage and family therapy, Dr. Reid offers a unique perspective on hypersexual behaviors informed by empirical research and clinical experience. He was the principal investigator for the UCLA independent DSM-5 Field Trial for Hypersexual Disorder and has published numerous research articles on hypersexual behavior and ADHD.

**Mavis Humes Baird, CADC, CMAT-S, CSAT-S, ICADC** has developed and won acclaim for intervention and treatment programs in various modes for both adolescent and adult addicts, family members, couples, whole families and other groups. She has worked privately and at world renowned treatment centers with sex addicts and their family members since 1988. Her focus has always included addictions, eating disorders, sexual abuse, family systems, complex addiction interactions, and chronic relational stress. In 2008, Mavis contributed a chapter entitled, What Can The 12 Steps Do For Me? to a book for partners of sex addicts, *Mending A Shattered Heart*, Stefanie Carnes Ph.D., editor. She is a contributor to educational media pieces on sex addiction, including Issues with Jane Velez, InTouch Mag, CBS, Marie Claire, and blogs for The New York Times. Mavis has a Manhattan-based consulting and recovery coaching service

providing customized experiences, workshops, interventions and coaching packages. Keystone ECU is a special place for her and her family.

**Marty Revell, LMFT, CCAADC, CSAT-S, CMAT** is Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist and a Certified Sex Addiction Therapist working at Sexual Recovery Institute in Los Angeles. She is a graduate of the Master's of Clinical Psychology program at Antioch University, Los Angeles, where she trained in LGBT Affirmative Psychotherapy. Marty and has a special interest in the relationship between Family of Origin, trauma, religion, addiction and intimacy. She specializes in couple's communication, mindfulness and nurturing a differentiated sense of Self all of which are key to developing healthy intimacy in relationship. She utilizes CBT, psycho-dynamic modalities (including Jungian and Voice Dialogue techniques,) and Non-Violent Communication with mindfulness practices, and works relationally. Marty recently completed the Daring Way™ training founded by Brene Brown, PhD. She runs 2 weekly groups for partners of sex addicts with a trauma model and personal empowerment approach. She sees male and female addicts, partners and recovering couples in outpatient therapy, runs groups and teaches lectures in the SRI 2-week Intensive Outpatient Program

**Nina M. Laltrello, LMFT, CCAADC, CSAT-S, CMAT** is a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist and additionally credentialed as a Certified Clinical Advanced Alcohol and Drug Counselor and Certified Sex Addiction Therapist Supervisor. She has practiced in the Atlanta Area for over 20 years. In 2012 she created Relationship Recovery Center, LLC, A Healing Place for individual, couples and families recovering from chemical and process addictions. She has trained extensively with Dr. Patrick Carnes post-CSAT training in a two-year process called The Professional Improvement Program. **Sandra Maddock, LCSW, CSAT-S** is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker who has been practicing since 1986. She has had a certification as a sexual addictions therapist since 2006, and recently became a supervisor in this field. She has also trained to become a "Specialist" in treating Problematic Sexual Behavior. Ms. Maddock is currently in private practice in Oakridge New Jersey. She specializes in treating sexual addiction and partners of addicts. She also works with couples as they navigate the difficult terrain of healing after a betrayal and rebuilding trust within their relationships. Ms. Maddock previously had private practices in Delaware, Georgia, and Michigan.

**Amy Bloom, LCSW, CSAT** is a clinical social worker from Bryn Mawr College and started working with addictions in 1996. I have worked in a number of specialties in addiction such as eating disorders and alcoholism. I went to the International Institute for Trauma and Addiction Professionals two years after seeing Dr. Patrick Carnes present in Santa Fe, NM at a conference called Stress in the Family. I did not know it was specifically about sex addiction but after days at the conference I realized that sex addiction and/or sexually compulsive activities were going on all around me from my circle of friends with young children to the clients who I was working with. Although all addictions have a huge effect on the spouses, sex addiction completely alter's the relationship in most cases. A licensed counselor and therapist with over a decade in practice treating depression, bipolar disorder, and anxiety, I am also a certified sex addiction therapist with additional studies in multiple addiction therapy. Prior to private practice I worked in hospitals as a crisis specialist providing services in addiction, family, and group therapies.

**Betsy Crane, Ph.D** is known for creating a fun and relaxed atmosphere to talk about sex. Betsy Crane, Ph.D. is Professor, Center for Human Sexuality Studies, Widener University, Chester, PA. Dr. Crane earned an MA in Communications with a concentration in Mental Health Education from University of Texas in 1972, and a Ph.D. in Human Service Studies from Cornell University in 2000. She worked for 17 years as a sexuality educator, first as a public health family planning outreach worker, then as Education Director and later Executive Director for Planned Parenthood in Ithaca, NY. She is an author of several journal articles, curricula, and professional publications as well as co-editor of *Sexual Lives: A Reader on the Theories and Realities of Human Sexualities* (Heasley & Crane, McGraw-Hill, 2003). Her research interests include the history of gendered sexuality, and shifting gender and sexual identities of young people, as well as strengths-based empowerment practice in human services.

**Cara W. Tripodi, LCSW, CSAT**, is the Executive Director and owner of S.T.A.R-Sexual Trauma and Recovery, Inc. in Wynnewood, PA, specializing in sexual addiction, sexual co-addiction, sexual anorexia and love/relationship addiction. Ms. Tripodi graduated from Bryn Mawr School of Social Work and Social Research in 1991 where she earned her Masters in Social Service. She has been treating both individuals and groups since that time. Ms. Tripodi is a national lecturer, workshop leader and consultant in the areas of out of control sex, and partners of intimate betrayal. Ms. Tripodi pioneered the first intensive program for partners of sex addicts for Pine Grove Behavioral Health Care in Hattiesburg, MS. She is the co-author of *Intimate Treason: Healing the Trauma for Partners Confronting Sex Addiction* (2012) and contributed to *Mending a Shattered Heart: A Guide for Partners of Sex Addicts* (2008). She is certified in Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR) and is a Certified Sex Addiction Therapist (CSAT), the first national certification for treating sexual addiction. Ms. Tripodi is a Board Member of The Society for the Advancement of Sexual Health (SASH) an organization dedicated to the field of problematic sexual behavior and research.
